<sup>8</sup> Keep me as the apple of the eye, hide me in the shelter of your wings.
<sup>9</sup> From wicked people who do me violence, from deadly foes who crowd around me.

<sup>10</sup> They have closed their hearts to pity, the words of their mouths are haughty.
<sup>11</sup> Now they dog us at every step, keenly watching, to hurl us to the ground,
<sup>12</sup> like a lion, longing to tear, like a young lion, lurking in secret.

<sup>13</sup> Arise, LORD, face them and fell them. By your sword set me free from the wicked,
<sup>14</sup> by your hand, O LORD, from those – whose portion of life is but of this world.
But let your treasured ones have food in plenty may their children be full and their children satisfied.

<sup>15</sup> In my innocence I will see your face, awake I am filled with a vision of you.

<sup>10</sup> He rode on a cherub and flew, darting on wings of wind,

- <sup>13</sup> The LORD thundered from heaven, the Most High uttered his voice.
- <sup>14</sup> He shot his arrows and scattered them, flashed lightnings, and routed them.

<sup>34</sup> He taught my hands how to fight, and my arms how to bend a bronze bow.
<sup>35</sup> The shield of your help you gave me, your right hand supports me, you stoop down to make me great.
<sup>36</sup> In your strength I took giant strides, and my feet never slipped.
<sup>37</sup> So I chased the foe till I caught them, and turned not, till I made an end of them.

<sup>38</sup> I smashed them, they could not rise, they fell beneath my feet.

<sup>39</sup> You did arm me with strength for war, you did bow my assailants beneath me.
<sup>40</sup> You made my foes turn their back to me, and those who did hate me I finished.
<sup>41</sup> They cried for help, but none saved them; to the LORD, but he answered them not.
<sup>42</sup> I beat them like dust of the market-place, stamped them like mud of the streets.

<sup>43</sup> From the strife of the peoples you saved me,

you made me head of the nations, peoples I knew not did serve me. <sup>44</sup> On the instant they hear, they obey me, foreigners come to me cringing. <sup>45</sup> Foreigners lose courage, and come out of their strongholds trembling.

<sup>46</sup> The LORD is alive! Blest be my rock! Exalted be God, my protector!
<sup>47</sup> The God who gave me revenge, and brought down nations beneath me,
<sup>48</sup> who saved me from angry foes, and set me above my assailants, safe from the violent.

<sup>49</sup> For this I will praise you among the nations, making music, O LORD, to your name:
<sup>50</sup> for great triumphs he grants to his king, and faithful love he shows his anointed, to David and his seed evermore.

For the leader. A psalm of David.
<sup>1</sup> The heavens declare God's glory, the sky tells what his hands have done.
<sup>2</sup> Day tells it to day, night reveals it to night,
<sup>3</sup> without speaking, without words; without the sound of voices.
<sup>4</sup> But through all the world their voice carries their words to the ends of the earth.

He has pitched a tent for the sun in the sky,

<sup>5</sup> it comes out like a bridegroom from his bridal chamber,

it joyfully runs its course like a hero. <sup>6</sup> From one end of the heavens it rises, and round it runs to the other, and nothing hides from its heat.

<sup>7</sup> The law of the LORD is perfect, renewing life. The decrees of the LORD are trusty, making the simple wise.

<sup>8</sup> The behests of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart.

<sup>9</sup> The fear of the LORD is clean, it endures forever. The LORD's judgments are true and right altogether.

- and grain of heaven he gave them.
- <sup>25</sup> Everyone ate the bread of angels; he sent them food to the full.

<sup>26</sup> He launched the east wind in the heavens, and guided the south by his power.
<sup>27</sup> He rained meat upon them like dust, **Psalms 78:28** 

winged bird like the sand of the sea. <sup>28</sup> In the midst of their camp he dropped it, all around their tents.

<sup>29</sup> They ate and were more than filled; he had brought them the thing they desired.
<sup>30</sup> But the thing they desired became loathsome: while their food was still in their mouths,
<sup>31</sup> the wrath of God rose against them. He slew the stoutest among them, and laid low the young men of Israel.

<sup>32</sup> Yet for all this they sinned yet more, and refused to believe in his wonders.
<sup>33</sup> So he ended their days in a breath, and their years in sudden dismay.
<sup>34</sup> When he slew them, then they sought after him, they turned and sought God with diligence.

<sup>35</sup> They remembered that God was their rock, and the Most High God their redeemer.
<sup>36</sup> But they flattered him with their mouth, and lied to him with their tongue.
<sup>37</sup> Their heart was not steady with him, they were faithless to his covenant.

<sup>38</sup> But he is full of pity: he pardons sin and destroys not.
Often he turns his anger away, without stirring his wrath at all.
<sup>39</sup> So he remembered that they were but flesh, breath that passes and does not return.

<sup>40</sup> But how often they rebelled in the desert,

and caused him grief in the wilderness, <sup>41</sup> tempting God again and again, provoking the Holy One of Israel. <sup>42</sup> They did not remember his strength, nor the day he redeemed from the foe, <sup>43</sup> how he set his signs in Egypt, in the country of Zoan his wonders.

<sup>44</sup> He turned their canals into blood, their streams undrinkable.

<sup>45</sup> He sent forth flies, which devoured them; frogs, too, which destroyed them.

- <sup>46</sup> Their crops he gave to the caterpillar, and the fruits of their toil to the locust.
- <sup>47</sup> He slew their vines with hail, and their sycamore trees with frost.

<sup>48</sup> He delivered their cattle to the hail, and their flocks to bolts of fire.

<sup>49</sup> He let loose his hot anger among them, fury and wrath and distress, a band of destroying angels.

<sup>50</sup> He cleared a path for his anger, did not spare them from death, but gave them over to pestilence.

<sup>51</sup> He struck down all the firstborn in Egypt, the first fruits of their strength in the tents of Ham.

<sup>52</sup> He led forth his people like sheep, he was guide to his flock in the desert.

<sup>53</sup> Securely he led them, and free from fear, while their foes were drowned in the sea. <sup>54</sup> To his holy realm he brought them, to the mountain his right hand had purchased. <sup>55</sup> He drove out the nations before them, and allotted their land for possession, and their tents for Israel to live in. <sup>56</sup> Yet they tempted and angered the Most High God. they did not observe his decrees. <sup>57</sup> They drew back, false like their ancestors; they failed like a treacherous bow. <sup>58</sup> Their shrines stirred him to anger, their idols moved him to jealousy. <sup>59</sup> When God heard of this, he was furious, and he spurned Israel utterly. <sup>60</sup> He abandoned his home in Shiloh, the tent he had pitched among people. <sup>61</sup> He gave his strength up to captivity, his glory to the hands of the foe. <sup>62</sup> He gave his people to the sword, he was furious with his own. <sup>63</sup> Fire devoured their young men, and their maidens had no marriage-song. <sup>64</sup> Their priests fell by the sword, and their widows could not weep.

<sup>65</sup> Then the LORD awoke as from sleep, like a warrior flushed with wine;
<sup>66</sup> and he beat back his foes, putting them to perpetual scorn.
<sup>67</sup> He disowned the tent of Joseph,

The prayer: for a weary and suffering person who pours out their grief to the LORD.
<sup>1</sup> Hear my prayer, O LORD; let my cry for help come to you.
<sup>2</sup> Hide not your face from me in the day of my distress.
Incline your ear to me: when I call, answer me speedily.
<sup>3</sup> For my days pass away like smoke: my bones are burned through as with fire.
<sup>4</sup> My heart is scorched, withered like grass; I forget to eat my bread.

<sup>5</sup> By reason of my loud groaning, my flesh clings to my bones.

<sup>6</sup> Like a desert-owl of the wilderness, like an owl among ruins am I.

<sup>7</sup> I make my sleepless lament like a bird on the house-top alone.

<sup>8</sup> All the day wild foes revile me, using my name for a curse.

<sup>9</sup> For ashes have been my bread, and tears have been mixed with my cup.
<sup>10</sup> Because of your passionate anger, you did raise me, then hurl me to the ground.
<sup>11</sup> My days come to an end, shadows lengthen, I wither like grass. Psalms 102:12

- <sup>12</sup> But you, O LORD, are enthroned forever, your fame endures to all generations.
- <sup>13</sup> You will arise and have pity on Zion;

it's time to be gracious; her hour has come.

- <sup>14</sup> For even her stones are dear to your servants, even the dust of her ruins they look on with love.
- <sup>15</sup> Then the nations will revere the name of the LORD

and all the kings of the earth his glory,

- <sup>16</sup> when the LORD shall have built up Zion, and revealed himself in his glory,

oil, to make faces shine; bread, to strengthen hearts. <sup>16</sup> The trees of the LORD drink their fill the cedars he planted on Lebanon, <sup>17</sup> where the little birds build their nest. and the stork whose home is the cypress. <sup>18</sup> The high hills are for the wild goats, and the rocks are for coneys to hide in. <sup>19</sup> He created the moon to mark seasons. and told the sun when to set. <sup>20</sup> You make it dark: night comes, when all the wild beasts creep out. <sup>21</sup> Young lions that roar for their prey, seeking their meat from God. <sup>22</sup> At sunrise they slink away, and lie down in their dens. <sup>23</sup> Then people go forth to their work, and toil till evening. <sup>24</sup> How many, O LORD, are your works,

all of them made in wisdom! The earth is filled with your creatures.

<sup>25</sup> And there is the great broad sea, where are countless things in motion, living creatures, both great and small.

<sup>26</sup> There go the ships,

and the Leviathan you made to play there.

<sup>27</sup> They all look in hope to you,

to give them their food in due season.

<sup>28</sup> And you give with open hand;

they gather and eat to their heart's desire. <sup>29</sup> When you hide your face, they are terrified; Psalms 104:30

clvii

when you take their breath away, they die and go back to their dust. <sup>30</sup> But a breath from your lips creates them, and renews the face of the earth.

<sup>31</sup> May the glory of the LORD be forever, may the LORD rejoice in his works.

- <sup>32</sup> A glance of his makes the earth tremble, a touch of his makes the hills smoke.
- <sup>33</sup> I will sing to the LORD while I live, I will play to my God while I am.

<sup>34</sup> May my musing be sweet to him, for I rejoice in the LORD.

<sup>35</sup> But may sinners be swept from the earth, and the wicked vanish forever. O my soul, bless the LORD.

<sup>1</sup> Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name: make known his deeds among the nations.

<sup>13</sup> wandering from nation to nation,

journeying from people to people, <sup>14</sup> he allowed no one to oppress them, even punishing kings for their sakes.

<sup>15</sup> He forbade them to touch his anointed, or do any hurt to his prophets.

<sup>16</sup> When he called down famine on the land, and cut off the bread which sustained them,

<sup>17</sup> he sent before them a man,

Joseph, who was sold as a slave. <sup>18</sup> His feet were galled with fetters,

he was laid in chains of iron,

<sup>19</sup> till the time that his word came to pass, the word of the LORD that had tried him.

<sup>20</sup> The king sent and freed him, the ruler of nations released him.
<sup>21</sup> He made him lord of his household, and ruler of all his possessions,
<sup>22</sup> to admonish his princes at will and instruct his elders in wisdom.

#### Psalms 105:23

<sup>13</sup> But soon they forgot his deeds: they did not wait for his counsel.

<sup>14</sup> Their greed was ravenous in the desert; they put God to the test in the wilderness.

<sup>15</sup> He gave them the thing they had asked for, but sent wasting disease among them.

<sup>16</sup> The camp grew jealous of Moses and of Aaron, holy one of the LORD.
<sup>17</sup> The earth opened and swallowed up Dathan, and covered Abiram's company.
<sup>18</sup> Fire broke out on their company, flame kindled upon the wicked.

<sup>19</sup> They made a calf in Horeb, and bowed to the molten image. <sup>20</sup> They exchanged their glorious God for the image of ox that eats grass. <sup>21</sup> They forgot the God who had saved them by mighty deeds in Egypt <sup>22</sup> Wonders in the land of Ham, terrors by the Red Sea. <sup>23</sup> So he vowed, and would have destroyed them, but for Moses his elect. who stepped into the breach before him, to divert his deadly wrath. <sup>24</sup> They spurned the delightsome land, they refused to believe in his word. <sup>25</sup> They grumbled in their tents, would not listen to the voice of the LORD. <sup>26</sup> So he swore with uplifted hand to lay them low in the wilderness; <sup>27</sup> to disperse their seed among heathen, to scatter them over the world. <sup>28</sup> Then they joined them to Baal of Peor, and ate what was offered the dead. <sup>29</sup> They provoked him to wrath by their deeds, and plague broke out among them. <sup>30</sup> Then Phinehas stood between, and so the plague was stayed; <sup>31</sup> and it was counted to him for righteousness unto all generations forever. <sup>32</sup> They angered him at the waters of Meribah,

through them it went ill with Moses.

<sup>33</sup> They rebelled against his spirit,

#### and he uttered speech that was rash.

<sup>34</sup> They did not destroy the nations, as the LORD had commanded them: <sup>35</sup> but they mingled with the heathen, and learned to do as they did. <sup>36</sup> Their idol gods they worshipped, and they were ensnared by them. <sup>37</sup> They sacrificed their sons and their daughters to the demons. <sup>38</sup> They poured out innocent blood the blood of their sons and daughters whom they offered to Canaan's idols, and the land was polluted with blood. <sup>39</sup> They became unclean by their works, and adulterous in their deeds. <sup>40</sup> Then the LORD's fury was on his people, filled with horror at his inheritance. <sup>41</sup> He delivered them to the heathen, to the sway of those who hated them. <sup>42</sup> Their enemies oppressed them, and subdued them under their hand. <sup>43</sup> Many a time he saved them, but they rebelled at his counsel, and were brought low by their wrongdoing. <sup>44</sup> Yet he looked upon their distress, when he heard their cry. <sup>45</sup> He remembered his covenant, and, in his great kindness, relented. <sup>46</sup> He caused them to be pitied by all who carried them captive.

<sup>43</sup> Snatch not from my mouth the word of truth, for in your judgments I hope. <sup>44</sup> I will keep your law continually, for ever and evermore. <sup>45</sup> So shall I walk in wide spaces, for I give my mind to your precepts. <sup>46</sup> I will speak of your charge before kings, and will not be ashamed thereof. <sup>47</sup> Your commandments are my delight, I love them exceedingly. <sup>48</sup> I will lift up my hands to your commandments, and muse upon your statutes. <sup>49</sup> Remember your word to your servant, on which you have made me to hope. <sup>50</sup> This is my comfort in trouble, that your word gives life to me. <sup>51</sup> The arrogant utterly scorn me, but I have not declined from your law. <sup>52</sup> When I think of your judgments of old, O LORD, I take to me comfort. <sup>53</sup> I am seized with glowing anger at the wicked who forsake your law. <sup>54</sup> Your statutes have been to me songs in the house of my pilgrimage. <sup>55</sup> I remember your name in the night, O LORD and observe your law. <sup>56</sup> My lot has been this, that I have kept your precepts. <sup>57</sup> My portion are you, O LORD: I have promised to keep your words. <sup>58</sup> I entreat you with all my heart; grant me your promised favour. <sup>59</sup> I have thought upon my ways,

and turned my feet to your charges. <sup>60</sup> I hasted and tarried not to give heed to your commandments. <sup>61</sup> Though the godless have wound their cords round me. I have not forgotten your law. <sup>62</sup> At midnight I rise to praise you because of your righteous judgments. <sup>63</sup> With all those who fear you I company, aid with those who observe your precepts. <sup>64</sup> The earth, LORD, is full of your kindness; teach me your Statutes. <sup>65</sup> Well have you dealt with your servant, as you have promised, O LORD. <sup>66</sup> Teach me discretion and knowledge, for I have believed your commandments. <sup>67</sup> Till trouble came I was a wanderer, but now I observe your word. <sup>68</sup> You are good and do good; teach me your statutes. <sup>69</sup> The proud have forged lies against me, but I keep your precepts with all my heart. <sup>70</sup> Their heart is gross like fat, but I delight in your law. <sup>71</sup> It was good for me to be humbled, that I should learn your statutes. <sup>72</sup> The law of your mouth is better to me than thousands of pieces of silver and gold. <sup>73</sup> Your hands have made me and fashioned me: make me wise to learn your commandments.

<sup>74</sup> Those who fear you shall see me with joy,

for in your word have I hoped. <sup>75</sup> I know, O LORD, that your judgments are right, and in faithfulness you have afflicted me. <sup>76</sup> Let your love be a comfort to me, for so have you promised your servant. <sup>77</sup> Visit me with your quickening pity, for your law is my delight. <sup>78</sup> Put the proud to shame, who have wronged me falsely: I will muse on your precepts. <sup>79</sup> Let those turn to me who fear you, that they may learn your charges. <sup>80</sup> Let my heart be sound in your statutes, that I may not be put to shame. <sup>81</sup> My long for you to rescue me, I put my hope in your word. <sup>82</sup> My eyes pine away for your promise: saying, 'When will you comfort me?' <sup>83</sup> Though shrivelled like wine-skin in smoke, your statutes I have not forgotten. <sup>84</sup> How few are the days of your servant! When will you judge those who harass me? <sup>85</sup> Proud people have dug for me pits people who do not conform to your law. <sup>86</sup> All your commandments are trusty. With falsehood they harass me: help me. <sup>87</sup> They had nearly made an end of me, yet I did not forget your precepts. <sup>88</sup> Spare me in your kindness, and I will observe the charge of your mouth.

fixed firmly in the heavens. <sup>90</sup> Your truth endures age after age; it is established on earth, and it stands. <sup>91</sup> By your appointment they stand this day, for all are your servants. <sup>92</sup> Had not your law been my joy, in my misery then had I perished. <sup>93</sup> I will never forget your precepts, for through them you have put life in me. <sup>94</sup> I am yours, O save me, for I give my mind to your precepts. <sup>95</sup> The wicked lay wait to destroy me, but I give heed to your charge. <sup>96</sup> I have seen a limit to all things: but your commandment is spacious exceedingly. <sup>97</sup> O how I love your law! All the day long I muse on it. <sup>98</sup> Your commandment makes me wiser than my enemies: for it is mine forever. <sup>99</sup> I am prudent above all my teachers, for your charges are my meditation. <sup>100</sup> I have insight more than the aged, because I observe your precepts. <sup>101</sup> I refrain my foot from all wicked ways,

that I may keep your word.

<sup>102</sup> I turn not aside from your judgments, for you yourself are my teacher.

<sup>103</sup> How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!

therefore every false way I hate.

<sup>106</sup> I have sworn an oath, and will keep it, to observe your righteous judgments.
<sup>107</sup> I am afflicted sorely: revive me, O LORD, as you said.

- <sup>108</sup> Accept, LORD, my willing praise, and teach me your judgments.
- <sup>109</sup> My life is in ceaseless peril; but I do not forget your law.
- <sup>110</sup> The wicked set traps for me, yet I do not stray from your precepts.
- <sup>111</sup> In your charges are my everlasting inheritance,
  - they are the joy of my heart.
- <sup>112</sup> I am resolved to perform your statutes forever, to the utmost.
- <sup>113</sup> I hate people of divided heart, but your law do I love.
- <sup>114</sup> You are my shelter and shield: in your word do I hope.
- <sup>115</sup> Begone, you wicked people, I will keep the commands of my God.
- <sup>116</sup> Uphold me and spare me, as you have promised:

O disappoint me not.

<sup>117</sup> Hold me up, and I shall be saved:

and your statutes shall be my unceasing delight.

<sup>118</sup> All who swerve from your statutes you spurn:
